<p>Go on a "Symmetry Hunt" around your home, just like the one we did in school a few weeks ago. Note down whether the object has symmetry in its shape, design or colour...or maybe all three!</p>	<p>Create your own wordsearch. Double-check your spellings in a dictionary. Don't forget to include the list of words at the bottom!</p>	<p>Imir ceann de na cluichí seo (play one of these games) http://www.nicurriculum.org.uk/snas_ar_sce_al/cluichi-ec1/</p>	<p>Tune into "Elevenses with The World of David Walliams" to listen to a free audio story. <p>Write a timetable of your day. Record things such as: what time you woke at, what time you ate breakfast/lunch/dinner, what time you played/did schoolwork, what time you went to bed etc. For an extra challenge you could study your timetable the next day and figure out how much time you spent doing each activity.</p>	<p>Write a persuasive letter to a parent to try to convince them to do/let you do something you feel strongly about. Remember what we learned about persuasive writing in school - clear arguments with examples and evidence to support your opinion. You can use the planning template to help you if you wish.</p>	<p>Learn and practise some new phrases from "Déan Comhrá". Tosaigh ar leathanach 4 - "Beannachtaí agus Frásaí Úsáideacha" (Greetings and Useful Phrases) Can you teach some phrases to a family member and have a short conversation?</p>	<p>Remember the work we started in History about "Schools and Education in the Past"? Write a list of questions to ask a grandparent or older relative about their memories of their school days. Then give them a call and interview them! They are probably really missing you and will love to hear from you!</p>
<p>Play "Hit the Button" just like we do in school to practise your multiplication and division tables! Challenge yourself to try harder questions and work on improving your score each time.</p>	<p>Play "Naming Nouns" just like we do in school. The printable answer grid and letters are on our Third Class webpage. Or you can easily draw/write out your own if you wish!</p>	<p>Déan iarracht an "Cup Song as Gaeilge" a fhoghlaim. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Bhlw_qwrrpE&list=RDBhlw_qwrrpE&index=5</p>	<p>Create your own obstacle course either inside your house or outside in your garden. Ask an adult to check that it's safe and suitable for all. Then invite your family members to try it out. You could even time them to see who is the fittest!</p>
<p>Practise some addition or subtraction sums from the worksheets on the Third Class webpage. You can either print off and complete on the sheet or just look at the sums and copy them down. Don't forget to watch out for renaming when it's needed!</p>	<p>Prepare and present a movie review to your family. Summarise the plot, describe the main characters and settings and express your opinion on the movie in general. Would you recommend it? What age group is it suitable for? Is there a sequel?</p>	<p>Teach "Ceann, Gualainn, Glúine, Barraicíní" to a family member. Remember you can make it harder by getting faster each time or by leaving words out!</p>	<p>Draw a map of your neighbourhood. Include your own home and other local buildings/landmarks. If you are out for a walk with your family you can take notes or pictures to help you. If not just give it your best shot and see what you can do from memory!</p>
